This guide is designed to prepare students for their cultural field trip and to facilitate class discussion afterwards.

The guide contains information on all the short films:

- Basic information including the film's title, country of origin, duration year, type and the name(s) of the filmmaker(s);
- The film's synopsis and main themes;
- A simple question that can guide students in their viewing;
- A space for students to rate the film on a five-star scale;
- Ideas to help prepare and develop the students' contextual or cinematographic knowledge of the film. The activities or discussions are classified by colour: PINK for those to do before the projection, and GREEN for those to do after!

At the end of the guide there are complementary activities to be done after watching the films.

Finally, the last part contains answers to the questions posed in the booklet, and maybe in the activities or discussions. Easy to spot, they're there to help, so no cheating!





If you would like to see the films again in class, they will be available online from March 25 until the end of the school year. Teachers, watch your inbox for access info!


It's ideal for:

Preparing for a trip to REGARD

During the school trip, don't forget to...

- Greet the members of the REGARD team, including volunteers, when you meet them;

- Save your comments and reactions for the credits.


It is normal to feel all kinds of emotions during the screening, because cinema is art! Some films will make you feel a stronger response than others. You might even want to share your reaction with your friends sitting nearby. However, since the films are very short, please stay silent except during the credits so as not to disturb others.

The art of reading subtitles

As you know, this program is 100% in English. To help you understand everything, we've arranged for English subtitles to be included. It isn't always easy to absorb all the visual information on-screen when you're reading the dialogue. Here are some tips for making the most of the screening:

- As in any somewhat stressful situation, it's best to breathe through your nose. It isn't a big deal if you don't understand every word.
- The subtitles are there to help with comprehension. Let the images and characters' body language guide you. If needed, you can choose to scan only a few key words from the subtitles.
- A film is a work of art, which means you aren't required to understand precisely what the filmmaker is trying to say. You're completely free to appreciate the film in your own way.

Synopsis

Preparatory discussion

Joleen is an inspiration to her community, and to young people in general in the fashion industry. Do some research and find an inspirational Indigenous person to introduce to your class.

Post-viewing discussion

One of the characters in the film says something very important: "Representation matters".

What impact does <u>Vancouver Indigenous</u>
<u>Fashion Week</u> have on the young people taking part?

In your opinion is there enough diversity in the fashion world? In film? In sport?

Do you know any celebrities who look like you and make you feel anything is possible?

Synopsis

Preparatory discussion

This short film uses various classic comedic devices:

- character comedy: when the humour is inherent in the character himself, his tastes, his mannerisms.
- *situational comedy*: featuring unexpected encounters, misunderstandings, mishaps, etc.

While watching the film, ask yourself:

What is it about Edgar's personality that makes for character comedy?

Can you find examples of situational comedy?

Post-viewing discussion

Have you noticed that as the cow grows, the frame gets tighter. What is the point of this?



What is the first thing Edgar starts questioning after his visit to the farm?


Preparatory discussion

To understand a film, sometimes it is good to look at its title. In this case, the title is a biblical reference. In Christian mythology, the world was created in seven days; each day, a new element is added. On the fifth day, animals are added and, on the sixth, humans are added. With that in mind, what do you expect from this film before seeing it? After the projection ask yourself if yourpredictions are correct.

Post-viewing discussion

Believe it or not, this is a 3D animation, although the style is that of a stop-motion animation – in which real-life objects are moved incrementally and photographed to create the illusion of movement when played back. Although lovely to look at, it is a time-consuming art, so it is becoming increasingly common to use 3D animation to imitate the aesthetic. Can you identify the elements that make the film look like stop motion? Do you think the effect is successful?

Post-viewing discussion


The moment in the film when the girls dance together in the gym, a safe space, is liberating. The main character is tense and anxious and for her, the dance is a break from the torments of the day. The film's director wants to give viewers a similar feeling: a moment of joy amidst the viewing of a rather tense, even nerve-wracking film.

Do you think this effect was successful? What did you think of this scene?

Post-viewing activity

The characters wear school uniforms in the film. Is a uniform compulsory at your school? In class, organise a debate: are you for or against uniforms? As a team, come up with solid arguments and defend them in front of the class. And don't forget to come up with counter-arguments to answer your opponents!

Do you know any other influencers who use social media to highlight a cause important to them? Do you follow people who have a positive effect on your mental health or your understanding of it? A foreshadowing technique is used in this film, a narrative device that consists of giving clues early on to future events in the story. Here, a visual element near the beginning of the film can help us guess how it will end. Can you spot it?

Post-viewing activity


This film plays on literal and figurative expressions. Here, the expression "I can't be everywhere at once" is used to mean that it's impossible to multiply oneself.

It's your turn: write a synopsis based on an expression of your choice. Try playing around with its literal meaning.

You can use the following expressions to help:

- Wearing your heart on your sleeve;
- Having your head in the clouds;
- Pulling wool over your eyes;
- Putting oil on the fire;
- Etc.

Between loads of laundry at the corner laundromat, Cooper shares the story of her gender reassignment journey. Piecing together hermemories, Cooper attempts to make peace with the last male imprint remaining on her body: that annoying deep voice that sticks to her skin.

Preparatory activityDirector Amélie Hardy

Director Amélie Hardy specialises in documentaries that combine humanity, aestheticism and creative reality staging. In 2022, while producing the series *Chroniques de la vie ordinaire* (TV5), she met Cooper Josephine Holt. Inspired by Cooper's life story, the two women worked on the script for the docu-drama *Hello Stranger*. To see the spark that ignited the project, watch the first <u>4-minute episode</u> of the series. (In French, but it's worth it!)

Post-viewing discussion

Cooper's quest is inspiring and universal for it's not just about gender transition, it's also about self-affirmation. As a group, ask yourself these questions: what allows us to really be ourselves? What do we do on a daily basis to please others more than ourselves?



When did Cooper know she was a woman?

The films *Cut!* and *My name is Edgar* and *I Have a Cow* both are from the **Czech Republic**. Born in **Slovakia**, the director of the latter, Filip Diviak, has been working in the Czech Republic for several years.

Working between **Toronto** and **Vancouver**, the director of *Ancestral Threads*, Indigenous filmmaker Sean Stiller, is a member of the William's Lake First Nations (T'exelc).

Rapper Akintoye also lives near Toronto, in the Vaughan suburb. It is a long way from his native **Nigeria!**

Amélie Hardy and Cooper Josephine Holt met while filming a documentary series on **Montreal** neighbourhoods. To shoot *Hello Stranger*, they travelled as far as **Nova Scotia**, to the village where Cooper grew up.

The animated shorts *Next?* and *Au 8*^{ème} *jour* were both made in **France**. The film Barricade comes from the **UK**.





















Cultural newspaper

By showing the cow taking up space in Edgar's life, it gives the viewer a sense of discomfort, of embarrassment about the space the cow takes up.

Insects and birds are the first to be affected; elephants are the first to be buried.

Can you identify the elements that make the film appear to be in stop motion?

- The texture of the wool is realistic. It looks like the characters and sets are made of fabric. You can even see the seams.
- Movements are sometimes a little jerkier than general 3D animation.
- Etc.

Barricade

What gives the main character the courage to face up to her bully?

She felt like she could have had the support of a group. At the beginning of the film, she is often alone; at lunch she is surrounded by people she trusts.
